## **Pre-Business Advising Worksheet (2004-05)**

Pre-Business is not a degree-granting program. All Pre-business students must complete the Pre-Business freshman core (Econ 211 & 212, Engl 101 & 102/103, both math and science sequences) and have a cumulative grade-point ratio of 2.0 or better *before* being admitted into a degree-granting program (exception: Marketing requires a 3.0 gpr). Students *must* complete the freshman core and declare a business major by the end of their sophomore year; however, students should declare their major as soon as they complete the freshman core.
