Pre-Business is not a degree-granting program. All Pre-business students must complete the Pre-Business <u>freshman core</u> and have a cumulative grade-point ratio of *2.0 or better before* being admitted into a degree-granting program (exception: Marketing requires a 3.0 gpr). Students <u>must</u> complete the freshman core and declare a business major by the end of their sophomore year; however, students should declare their major as soon as they complete the freshman core.
