

Pre-Business Advising Worksheet (2006-07)

Pre-Business is not a degree-granting program. All Pre-business students must complete the 31-hour freshman core listed below and have a cumulative grade-point ratio of *2.0 or better before* being admitted into a degree-granting business program (exception: Marketing requires a 3.0 gpr). Students must complete the freshman core and declare a business major by the end of their fourth semester; however, in order to maintain timely progress toward graduation, students should declare a major by the end of their second semester.
