NOTE: Advising worksheets are supplemental planning aids. Every effort is made to ensure accuracy; however, it is the student's responsibility to understand and meet degree requirements as stated in the applicable Undergraduate Announcements. Pre-Business is not a degree-granting program. All Pre-Business students must complete 30 hours, including core courses listed in the freshman curriculum (core courses are listed below in <u>BOLD</u> <u>ITALICS</u>) and have a cumulative grade-point ratio of 2.0 or better before being admitted into a degree-granting business program (exception: Marketing requires a 3.0 gpr). Students <u>must</u> complete the freshman core and declare a business major by the end of their fourth semester; however, in order to maintain timely progress toward graduation, students should declare a major by the end of their second semester. Registration for nearly all 300- and all 400-level business courses is restricted to students in their degree major.
