All Pre-Business students must complete the Pre-Business freshman core (core courses listed below in BOLD ITALICS) and have a cumulative gradepoint ratio of 2.0 or better before being admitted into a degree-granting business program (exception: Marketing requires a 3.0 gpr). Students must complete the freshman core and declare a business major by the end of their fourth semester; however, in order to maintain timely progress toward graduation, students should declare a major by the end of their second semester. Registration for 300- and 400-level business courses may be restricted to students in their degree major.
