# **Teaching Experiences**

*Lecturer*, Clemson University (August 2012 – present)

*Introduction to Public Speaking (COMM 2500) – Traditional, Hybrid, Honors –* According to the catalog, this course offers practical instruction in public speaking; practice in the preparation, delivery, and criticism of short speeches. The class develops an understanding and knowledge of the process of communication.

*Introduction to Human Communication (COMM2010) – Online* – According to the catalog, the class introduces Communication Studies majors to and prepares them for continued study in the discipline by providing them with an overview of important issues, areas of study, and approaches to the field. Includes a writing laboratory experience.

*Introduction to Human Communication (COMM 1500)* – According to the catalog, this course offers an overview of theoretical approaches to the study of communication, including the theory and practice of interpersonal/small group/intercultural/public communication. The laboratory component provides supplemental opportunities for practical applications of the content discussed in lecture, providing students with more performance time, focused and individual instruction, and more self-reflection.

*Interpersonal Communication (COMM3480) – Online* – According to the catalog, this course surveys the theories and research in interpersonal communication with emphasis on the application of research findings and developmental strategies for intra- and intercultural relationships.

"'How You Doin'?': Examining Interpersonal Communication on the TV Show Friends" (COMM3990) – This course is a creative inquiry in Communication Studies. In consultation with and under the direction of a faculty member, students pursue small group work on a particular research topic or practical problems. This course will focus on interpersonal communication in connection with the popular TV show *Friends*.

*Applied Communication in Cultural Contexts (COMM3600) – Study Abroad* – Students apply communication theory, concepts, and processes to understanding a variety of practical situations and communication contexts. As part of the course, students will create a website outlining the main information for studying abroad on this particular trip.

*Communication in the European Context (COMM3600) – Study Abroad* – Students will use travel time to learn the major communication factors that come into play when Americans travel in Europe. They will focus on food, drink, transportation, traditions and customs, as well as more detailed matters such as advertising, entertainment and political views. Students will be required to maintain records of their findings through video work as well as share information through Social Media.

*Non-Profit Leadership with Students Helping Honduras (COMM4900)* - In this course, the Students Helping Honduras (SHH) Executive team will continue to utilize effective communication strategies while improving each aspect of the chapter to raise awareness about the organization and raise funds for the projects in Honduras. The creation of this work will align directly with the mission of SHH.

*Building Schools or Building a Resume?: A Critical Approach to SHH (COMM3990)* – This course is a Creative Inquiry in which students reflect on their influence as they volunteer their time with Students Helping Honduras. They learn about and discuss issues related to acculturation and assimilation of cultures, intercultural effectiveness, and mediated communication as it relates to volunteering abroad. Overall, this class provides a space to think critically about Westerners volunteering in Honduras. It helps them better prepare for their trip to Honduras and allow create an opportunity to debrief their experience afterwards. The class allows them to find ways to better exploit their experience while making sure it keeps the focus of their efforts on the children of Honduras.

Adjunct Professor, Tri-County Technical College (March 2013 - present)

*Public Speaking (SPC 205)* – According to the catalog, this course is an introduction to the principles of public speaking with application of speaking skills.

*Graduate Teaching Assistant*, Eastern Illinois University (August 2010 – May 2012)

*Introduction to Speech Communication (CMN 1310)* – This course includes instruction in techniques of listening and informative, persuasive, and reactive speaking with an

emphasis on extemporaneous delivery. It provides students with fundamental knowledge about selecting, analyzing, evaluating, organizing, developing, and communicating information, evidence, and points of view orally.
