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## Research Interests

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My academic research is focused on memorials, commemoration and collective memory within the built environment; how events are represented, narrated, expressed and experienced within the larger landscape; and issues of social identity, cultural heritage and the spirit of place. I am particularly interested in social constructions and cultural attitudes towards nature and natural systems, e.g. the persistent narrative of pristine wilderness despite overwhelming evidence that natural systems have been fundamentally altered through human interaction and intervention. I regard the built environment as a medium that both transmits and generates cultural values informed by the works of historians W. J. T. Mitchell, Simon Schama, Caroline Merchant, Donald Worster, William Cronon and John R. Stilgoe, as well as media theorists such as Raymond Williams and Marshall McLuhan.
