## **DISSERTATION ABSTRACT**

L'école de la maladresse, de J.J.Rousseau à J.J. Grandville, XVIIIe-XIXe siècles.

My dissertation interweaves several critical perspectives in order to look at how clumsiness came to be valued as a sign both of sincerity and originality. From Jean-Jacques' numerous and unfortunate faux-pas – which result in his social exclusion – to Rastignac's blunders – which on the contrary allow him to enter and become part of high society – the ways in which clumsiness is looked at change dramatically in the course of the eighteenth and nineteenth centuries. Clumsiness will eventually imply a derision of social rules, rules that the maladroit in fact exploits and dramatizes, claiming one's ineptness becoming a powerful way to asserts one's originality.
