1. Books

- a. eBooks are searchable in the catalog by limiting to "Electronic Resources"
- b. Downloadable audio books are available via OneClick Digital from the catalog
 - i. You'll need to set up an account on campus, but can then access it from anywhere
- c. Books 24/7 via BlackBoard and CCIT
- d. Document Delivery to the offices of Faculty and Staff
- e. Delivery of items to the University Center in Greenville
 - i. Via Document Delivery or Hold/Recall button in the catalog
- f. PASCAL Delivers will let you borrow books from anywhere in the state of South Carolina in 3 days
- g. Interlibrary loan will enable you to borrow books from anywhere in the world to be delivered to the library for pick up or to the UC in Greenville.

2. Articles

- a. OneSearch box from homepage will get you to many articles and books
- b. "Find Articles" link will take you to a list of databases by topic
- c. You can select multiple databases in the EBSCO platform by clicking on "Find Articles", clicking on "Academic Search Complete", and then clicking on "Choose Databases".
- d. Google Scholar will link you to both articles and books
 - i. When you find a book in Google Books, there will often be a "Find in a Library" link that you can click on to see if Clemson owns the book
- e. Access to JCR (Journal Citation Reports) to find out rankings of journals

3. Other Resources Accessible Online

- a. Theses and Dissertations: access to full text online by going to "Where Can I Find" and clicking on "Theses and Dissertations"
- b. Online Workshops: cover topics like Advanced Google Searching, Evaluating Sources, and RefWorks
- c. Tutorials: for quick help with specific topics
- d. Music: access to streaming music by clicking on the Music Libguide
- e. Libguides: online guides compiled by librarians with helpful hints and websites available from the home page.
- f. Language Learning Resources: like Rosetta Stone and other play away devices
- g. Citation Tools: like Refworks that provide the ability to create personal databases of resources
