


Slide 2


Now what are the new features with this service pack?

- Global navigation tool: you will see the global navigation menu after you log in to Blackboard
- Posts: the latest posts in your course's discussion boards; Updates: all notifications for every courses such as assignment, or assessment; Calendar: include all events in all courses; My Grades: only available for students; Retention Center: specifically used for instructors




This is what the new updated calendar looks like. The calendar shows events for all courses you are enrolled in. You can view by day, week or month, and use the arrows to move to past or future dates. You can select which calendar displays in the frame, colorcode each calendar to help you distinguish between course events.

This is the new content editor, it is a WYSIWYG editor – meaning what you see is what you get. It allows you to format text, attach files, embed multimedia, and insert equations, hyperlinks, and tables. The content editor appears throughout the system in areas such as content areas, learning modules, folders, items, announcements, and test questions.


This is the new design of Discussion Board.

A discussion board contains several forums created by the course instructor to organize conversation topics. Within each forum, instructors and students, if they are allowed, create threads. A thread includes an original post and all of its replies. You can search for a post, see how many posts are in each forum, and jump to a collection of unread posts. Select a forum to view its thread, on the forum page, you can select how thread are displayed.

Slide 7



This tool is specifically for instructors to use. It has replaced the Early Warning system in an old version. Instructors can access it either from Global Navigation menu or the course level, from Control Panel – Evaluations – Retention Center. It provides an easy way for instructors to discover which students in their courses are at risk. Instructors can communicate with struggling students and help them take immediate action for improvement.




This is another new feature also for instructors to use to see statistics on overall test performance and on individual questions. You can see how many questions are good, fair, and poor discriminators of student performance. Identify and easily correct ineffective or misleading questions and your tests are re-graded automatically


