CU Libraries History

The main library was named for Robert Muldrow Cooper (1887-1966), a Lee county planter, businessman and member of the South Carolina House of Representatives (1919-1922) and Senate (1923-1933). A diligent supporter of Clemson College, he served on its Board of Trustees for forty-four years (1922-1966). He was President of the Board for fifteen years until his death in 1966, the year the library was dedicated.
