AUDIO VISUALS. 1970's, 2.5 cu. ft., 73 items, numbered and briefly described. Campaign films, many short, unedited, and soundless takes; radio tapes, usually 30 second spots; one 20 minute tape with Senator Thurmond introducing Governor John Connally who spoke in Young's behalf.

1. Clebe McClary, Vietnam veteran, young people. 16mm film, "Welcome to the Way." 4 minutes, filming repeated
2. Young press conference. 16mm film, no sound, 1 minute
3. Ed Young titles. 16mm film, no sound, 2 minutes
4. Young on inflation, the working man and inflation. 16mm film, 2 minutes, sound quality is good
5. Farmers, markets; Nixon and Young, but Nixon doesn't speak; Clebe McClary's endorsement of Young. 16mm film, sound quality good, 5 minutes
6. Housewife, insurance salesman, truck driver, businessman and youth worker. 16mm film, no sound, less than one minute
7. Congressman Young swearing in by Speaker Carl Albert and Congressman O'Neill. 16mm film, no sound, less than 1 minute
8. Young announcement at Sheraton. 16mm film, no sound
9. Tricia Nixon at Myrtle Beach, 1972. 16mm film, no sound, but she spoke and Young presented her with a hammock. Miss Nixon at Coastal Carolina. Handshaking and interview but no sound, audio tapes 46 and 64, less than 5 minutes
10. President Nixon and Young in Nixon's office. 16mm film, no sound, 2 minutes
11. Young at store, speaking. 16mm film, no sound, 12 minutes
12. Interview with Young and woman at store. 16mm film, several takes, no sound, 8 minutes
13. Young in cotton field. 16mm film, no sound, 12 minutes
14. Television commercials with sound. 16mm film, 4 minutes
15. Press conference, September 26, 1972. 16mm film, no sound, 5 minutes
16. Young in cotton field. 16mm film, no sound; duplicate of or continuation of item #13, 10 minutes

17. Interviews with a man in parking lot, in a field, in town. Takes for television campaign spots. 16mm film, sound, 10 minutes
18. Collective shots from items 11, 12, 61 and with President Nixon. 16mm film, sound, 10 minutes
19. Miscellaneous shots with Young and various people including a North Carolina Republican representative. 16mm film, sound, 1 minute. See also #27
20. Myrtle Beach, headlines from Charlotte Observer re Jenrette's company and sale of land it did not own. "Let's send an honest man to Congress." 1976. 16mm film, sound, 1 minute
21. 1976 campaign, same campaign against Jenrette as item 20 with different ending, "Middle America is a forgotten man." 16mm film, sound, 2 minutes
22. Young on tax veto and clips from Young on the street, bagging groceries, in nursing home, in police car, on education. 16mm film, sound, 2 minutes
23. Young in cotton field, in store. "Working man has made county great...bring industry to district." 16mm film, no sound, 3 minutes
24. Same as 23 and "develop market for farmers." 16mm film, no sound, 3 minutes
25. On farm, beach. Need for more jobs, "We need Ed Young in Washington." 16mm film, no sound, 30 seconds
26. "Milk Fund revised." Anti-Jenrette. "Let's put an honest man back in Congress." 16mm film, sound, 30 seconds
27. Congressman Mizell (RNC) agriculture tobacco sub-committee; Rev. Meares endorsement. 16mm film, sound, 1 minute
28. Young. "Turn government back to working man...get rid of special interests...4900 Brigade contributions not to exceed \$100.00." 16mm film, sound, 1 minute

32. Jenrette sold out to Wayne Hayes (Ohio), refused to vote him out of office. 16mm film, sound, less than 1 minute

34. Bill Magruder of Piedmont Airlines and Jimmy Sawyer, independent voters, support Young. 16mm film, sound, 1 minute
35. "Nettles for Young." Leroy Nettles, Lake City democrat will support Jimmy Carter but will also support Republican Young. 5 inch audio tape, 30 seconds
36. Four 30 second radio spots on income tax, farmer, congressional pay, and Jenrette, one of the least effective Congressmen. 5 inch audio tape, 2 minutes
37. Young radio speech citing differences between himself and John Jenrette: lifestyle, philosophy of government, art of persuasion, allegiances, and conclusions. August 31, 1976, 7 1/2 inch audio tape, 20 minutes
38. "Working man." Voice master. Several takes, 5 inch audio tape, 30 seconds each take
39. Ed Young shaking hands at factory, talking to men on street, on farm with cows, at Francis Marion with college students, with family, at Mobile office, and at a shopping mall. 16mm film on 15 inch reel, no sound, less than 15 minutes actual footage
40. Press conference, September 26, 1972. 16mm film, no sound, less than 45 minutes
41. "Clebe Sync." "Ed Young is great...faith in God." Many takes, 5 inch audio tape, 30 second takes
42. Young on Georgetown harbor, dredging, oppose destruction of marshland; work with education, Francis Marion. 5 inch audio tape, October 21, 1972, 15 minutes
43. "Ed Young sync #2," in cotton field campaigning for agricultural related industry. Unedited 5 inch audio tape, October 3, 1972, 10 minutes
44. "Ed Young helps the working man" interview and talking to people. Unedited 5 inch audio tape, October 3, 1972, 10 minutes

45. Young press conference. Re visit to White House, sale of tobacco to China, jobs in the South, people to people campaign and contributions. 7 1/2 inch audio tape, September 26, 1972, 45 minutes
46. Young/Covington. Tricia Nixon reads letter from her father, President Nixon. She is presented with a hammock. 7 1/2 inch audio tape, less than 5 minutes
47. Clebe McClary out takes. 7 1/2 inch audio tape, less than 5 minutes
- 48(1). Young press conference, October 3, 1972. Tobacco issues, support Nixon. 7 1/2 inch audio tape, 45 minutes

69. Working, industry, farmer, environment, drug problem, 2 minutes. 5 inch audio tape, 2 minutes
70. "Ed Young can get things done." Georgetown and Murrell's Inlet dredging. 5 inch audio tape, 30 seconds
71. Spiro Agnew, Vice-President, endorsement of Young in 1972 campaign, October, 1972. 3 inch audio tape, 1 minute

72. A number of 15mm films have been put on a 15 inch reel. Some are duplicates. Examples: Young in grocery store, on farm, at mall, with a North Carolina congressman, throwing football, a curve ball, on boat at Murrells Inlet, at tobacco auction with baby, etc. less than 15 minutes
73. John Connally and Senator Thurmond, January 26, 1974. Ed Young Appreciation Day. Senator Thurmond spoke eight minutes and introduced Governor Connally who then told jokes, praised Ed Young, and spoke on imports and energy issues. 7 1/2 inch audio tape, 40 minutes. 2 copies
