THE BROADCASTING COMPANY OF THE SOUTH. 1950-1967, Series 1, 2 cu. ft., folders 1-63. The records in this series include annual reports, board of directors' minutes, balance sheets, financial and income statements, and correspondence relating to the investment committee, management committee, and various radio and television stations. Unfortunately, records which include Accountants Report and Financial Statement, Annual Meeting, Balance Sheets, Bank Balance, Board of Director's Meetings, Broadcasting Company of the South Foundation, CATV, and Comparative Statement of Income – Radio Station WIS (Box 1) were not received from the Liberty Corporation Archives with the other records of this series. The Hipps' radio operations were a subsidiary of Surety Life Insurance Company in the 1940's. A separate entity, The Broadcasting Company of the South, was formed in August, 1950, to manage radio and television interests. B. Calhoun Hipp served as president of this company; among his correspondents were Francis M. Hipp, Robert R. Scales, Jr., and G. Richard Shafto.

In 1965, The Broadcasting Company of the South acquired a major-market television station, WTOL, of Toledo, Ohio. As a result of this geographic expansion, the parent company changed its name to Cosmos Broadcasting Corporation. As Chairman of the Board of Directors of Cosmos, B. Calhoun Hipp corresponded with a number of executives, including Francis M. Hipp and G. Richard Shafto.

The series contains files on the following departments: Audit, Advertising, Cashiers, Investment Division, Mortgage Loan, Real Estate, Securities, and the Treasurer's Office. There is substantial documentation of the firm's investment activities from 1950 – 1970, including the La Marick Beauty Systems and the Hollyridge Development Company. Prominent correspondents include Benjamin Bishop, Francis M. Hipp, and William Evans.

THE SURETY INSURANCE COMPANY. 1957-1965, Series 9, .05 cu. ft., folders 1-5. This series contains balance sheets, a code of accounts, and correspondence from Francis M. Hipp, Herman N. Hipp, John Lindsay, and B.C. Young.

Two different Hipp family-controlled companies took the name “The Surety Insurance Company.” From 1957 until 1961, The Surety Insurance Company was a property and casualty company and a wholly-owned subsidiary of The Surety Life Insurance Company. From 1962 until 1965, The Surety Insurance Company was a life insurance company and a wholly-owned subsidiary of Surety Investment Company. In December 1965, Liberty Life absorbed the life insurance business of The Surety Insurance Company, thus ending the latter company’s active operations.

SURETY INVESTMENT COMPANY. 1960-1968, Series 11, 1.4 cu. ft., folders 1-30.

Chartered in February 1962, Surety Investment Company was the successor firm of The Surety Life Insurance Company. Surety Investment Company's wholly-owned subsidiaries included The Surety Insurance Company, The Surety Indemnity Company, Surety Realty Corporation, and Premium Acceptance Corporation. The two insurance subsidiaries (The Surety Insurance and The Surety Indemnity) incurred losses exceeding \$800,000 by the end of 1964.

Consequently, Surety Investment Company transferred its life insurance business to Liberty Life at the end of 1965 and sold its casualty operations in April 1966. Operating as a real estate investment and development firm, Surety Investment Company acquired a chain of beauty salons (La Marick Beauty System) and built shopping centers in Columbia, S.C., and Morristown, Tenn. Additional projects included the Cleveland Street Apartment Complex in Greenville, the David Hills Executive Park Addition in Atlanta, and Howard Johnsons motels in Dallas and Miami. In December 1968, the Liberty Corporation acquired all the assets of Surety Investment Company in exchange for stock.

Among the records in this series are balance sheets, committee minutes, correspondence, financial projections, and memoranda. Notable correspondents include Benjamin Bishop, Tom Cousins, Harris Gravely, Herman Hipp, F. W. Lorick, and Carl Sanders.

THE SURETY LIFE INSURANCE COMPANY. 1950-1968, Series 12, .45 cu. ft., folders 1-15. This series contains audit reports, committee minutes, correspondence, and reports of security transactions. The files are arranged alphabetically, and each folder is organized chronologically.

In 1942, Southeastern Life Insurance Company (chartered in 1905) merged with The Liberty Life Insurance Company. All active insurance from The Liberty Life was transferred to Southeastern Life's 1905 charter. This newly formed corporation was entitled "Liberty Life Insurance Company." The old company founded in 1919 by W. Frank Hipp, formerly The Liberty Life Insurance Company, changed its name to Surety Life Insurance Company. Surety's assets consisted of paid-up insurance, real estate investments, and two Hipp family-owned radio stations. The merger agreement also stipulated that Surety Life would receive 5% of all premiums collected by the Industrial Division of Liberty Life Insurance Company until 1956. Surety Life did not sell insurance but remained active as a vehicle for reinsurance and investments.

Surety Life was reorganized in August 1950. The two radio stations were placed in a new firm, The Broadcasting Company of the South. A new entity, The Surety Life Insurance Company, was created to manage insurance, investments, and real estate operations. In 1955, The Surety Life recruited an agency sales force and began, for the first time, active solicitation of direct insurance. Its chief product, targeted to middle-class buyers was monthly debit ordinary (MDO) insurance. Wholly-owned subsidiaries of The Surety Life included The Surety Insurance Company, formed early in 1957 as a fire, property, and casualty company; Independence Insurance Company, a life insurance company chartered in 1930; and Liberty Life Building, Inc., later known as Surety Realty Corporation. Another reorganization of The Surety Life Insurance Company occurred in December 1961. Its successor firm became Surety Investment Company, with various specialized subsidiaries.

Prominent correspondents in this series include Francis M. Hipp, George H. Hipp, and William Evans.

SURETY REALTY CORPORATION. 1962-1968, Series 13, .05 cu. ft., folders 1-3. This series contains balance sheets, financial statements, and statements of income and expenses.

Surety Realty was originally organized in 1941 as a North Carolina corporation to own and operate the Liberty Life building in Charlotte. Its original title was Liberty Life Building, Inc. In 1961, the firm changed its name to Surety Realty Corporation, and it became a subsidiary of Surety Investment Company. The corporation was used to manage various investment properties such as Richland Mall in Columbia, S.C., and Morristown Plaza in Morristown, TN. Surety Realty Corporation passed out of existence in December 1968, when its parent company was acquired by The Liberty Corporation.
