Richland Recycles Day

Richland County residents can get rid of unwanted materials at the upcoming Richland Recycles Day! Bring your junk to the South Carolina State Fairgrounds from 7:00 AM to 6:00 PM for free disposal. This special collection event is held annually by the Richland County Solid Waste and Recycling Department to provide an opportunity to safely dispose of hazardous and hard to dispose of materials. This event is open to residents of Richland County only — no businesses, please. Please contact 576-2446 for questions or concerns.





The following materials will be accepted:

- Paper for shredding (limit five boxes)
- Electronics, such as stereos, TVs, microwaves, phones, fax machines, small appliances, power tools, etc.
- Tires cars, light trucks, bicycle and motorcycle (limit eight tires)
- Scrap metal and white goods stoves, washing machines, bicycles, metal chairs, shelves, refrigerators, air conditioners and lawn mowers, which must be free of gas
- Household hazardous waste (paint, cleaners, home pesticides, etc.)
- Mattresses
- Cooking oil
- Batteries
- Florescent light bulbs

Recent Activities:

Richland Backyard Landscaping Series

Thursday nights in March, RCSC offered a series of presentations on how to make backyards better for the environment and easier to care for. This four-part series was based on the Carolina Yards program, a recognition program from Clemson Extension. Participants learned about soils and fertilizer, composting, native plants, and caring for shorelines. This annual series will be offered again next spring with new environmentally friendly landscaping topics.



Rain Barrel and Compost Bin Sale

This spring, Richland County partnered with City of Columbia and Keep the midlands Beautiful to offer citizens an opportunity to buy rain barrels and compost bins at greatly reduced prices. A total of 145 rain barrels and 110 compost bins were sold. The sale was so successful, we are planning to offer it again next year, so if you missed it, watch for another chance next winter.

Sparkleberry Country Fair

On April 28th, visitors to the Sparkleberry Country Fair had many opportunities to learn about keeping the water clean. Richland County Stormwater had a display on preventing pollution, Carolina Clear had a display on the Carolina Yards



program, Gills Creek Watershed Association had a watershed model and information about local streams, and the Soil and Water Conservation District had a display on protecting the environment for wildlife. Sparkleberry Fair is a huge event that draws thousands each year. RCSC partners had a great time teaching and sharing with the public at this festival, and we look forward to attending more spring events!
