#### **Kayaks at Congaree**

The Richland Countywide Stormwater Consortium used its new 4-H2O Kayak Fleet for the first time on June 4<sup>th</sup>. Students and parents from the Nature Navigators Club at Catawba Trail Elementary School took a trip down Cedar Creek at Congaree National Park. The creek was swollen with recent rains. Congaree National Park is a special kind of wetland called a flood plain forest, and several times each year the water rises above the stream banks and floods the land in between, depositing sediment and nutrients that enrich the ecosystem. The students had a great time paddling between the trees, listening to birds and looking for wildlife along the creek.

#### **National Public Works Week Kids Day**


