Project Learning Tree Workshop

On February 8th, Benedict College students and Richland County teachers attended a Project Learning Tree workshop to learn fun ways to bring environmental education to their classrooms. PLT is a curriculum for K-8 educators that teaches a wide variety of environmental topics, incorporating science, math, reading, art and other subjects. The participants modeled activities from the curriculum, such as looking for diversity in the schoolyard, acting out the parts of a tree, and traveling through the water cycle. Everyone had a blast and took home a new appreciation for outdoor learning as well as useful curriculum materials for their careers. This workshop was hosted by the Richland Soil and Water Conservation District and Benedict College.
