Recent Activities:

Spring Litter Cleanups

Thanks to the efforts of our fantastic volunteers, Sumter is a cleaner place this spring. Three cleanups were held in the city and county. On March 8th, 20 volunteers, all from Crestwood High School, removed 28 bags of trash, 22 bags of recyclables, and 4 shopping carts from a stormwater ditch by Sumter Mall. On March 24th, volunteers cleaned up Manchester State Forest. On April 11th, 42 students from Wilson Hall School volunteered their time. One group worked in the city, picking up trash along Market Street. The other group collected trash from Cockerill Road and Lewis Road out in the county. For summer, another cleanup is scheduled for June 7th along Winston Road. Thank you, volunteers!

How do you stop shoreline erosion, reduce pond weeds and algae, keep pollution out of your pond or lake? Create a



shorescape! On Wednesday May 7th, Sumter County will be installing a shorescape along the edge of the main pond at Patriot Park. The badly eroded bank will be planted with ornamental grasses and native wildflowers, creating an attractive buffer to protect the shoreline and the pond.
