

No one can resist the draw of a packed venue — Solid Orange — the Clemson Tigers ready to take on their opponent. The band, the roar, the pride, the excitement. It's all a part of what makes Clemson Athletics so special to fans, alumni and student-athletes.

In 1934 Clemson had just been defeated 6-0 by The Citadel, not the only defeat that year. Fans were despondent. Joe Davis, Frank Jervey and Peter Hefner asked then-Coach Jess Neely how much money it would take for him to put out a good team. He replied that he thought he could do it with \$10,000 a year.


The group determined to ask team supporters for \$50 a year, but that amount proved to be too much in the middle of the Great Depression. But Rupert Fike met with other Clemson alums and penned the letter to Coach Neely that officially got the ball rolling: "Dear Coach, last night we had a little meeting at my house and organized the IPTAY Club." That IPTAY stood for :



Soccer player Katelyn Reeve was drawn to Clemson because she wanted the "full colleg experience." After looking at Dartmouth and a few smaller schools in her home state of North Carolina, she fell in love with Clemson after a campus visit.

Her IPTAY scholarship also was a big factor in her decision.

"My mom says we could have made it work without a scholarship, but I don't know how that would have been," said Reeve. "It means the world to me because I probably wouldn't be here without it."

Not only does her scholarship allow her to play soccer at Clemson, it also allows her to pursue her dream to become a physicians assistant (PA). Reeve will graduate in December — a semester early — with a degree in biological sciences. From there, she will go to PA school, something she has had to prepare for over the past few years.

PA school admission requires applicants to have 1,000 hours working directly with patients. Reeve is now certified as a nursing assistant (CNA), which required extra classes and clinical work in Greenville. She is working this summer as a CNA at St. Francis Hospital in Greenville.

As if all of that weren't enough, Reeve also volunteers at Oconee Medical Center, helps with Special Olympics and is a member of the student-athlete Be a T.I.G.E.R.! characterbuilding outreach program. She also spent two weeks on an international service-learning trip to Costa Rica and Panama where she worked at a medical clinic.

In Reeve's mind, it was all made possible by the scholarship provided to her by IPTAY.

"Once I have money and cushion, I'll definitely be giving back to IPTAY," she said. "It changed my life."





#### The IPTAY Priority Points system

The IPTAY Priority Points rewards system is another way of rewarding the loyalty of IPTAY members. Developed in an effort to reward gift amounts and long-term support in the distribution of tickets, seating and parking, Priority Points are also used for tickets to bowl games, the ACC basketball tournament and all road games.

IPTAY Priority Points are determined by a formula that utilizes both loyalty and contribution levels as shown in the chart below.

Years of donating to IPTAY + Total contributions + Annual level of giving points \$250

= IPTAY Priority Points



#### **IPTAY's Football Seat Equity Plan**

In 2008, Clemson joined the other Top 20 Division 1 FBS football attendance leaders in adding a preferred seating component to its annual giving program. Under the plan, season ticket holders who gave at or above the specified per-seat values qualified for specific seating in Memorial Stadium. (See seating map below.)

## 2014 SINGLE-GAME FOOTBALL TICKET INFORMATION

IPTAY donors may purchase single-game tickets based on their IPTAY level and points within each level after season ticket locations have been finalized. Single-game tickets will go on sale to the general public once IPTAY season and single-game ticket assignments are complete in early July.

Youth (18 and under) tickets will be available for the South Carolina State and Georgia State games for \$10. Children age 2 and under are admitted free to all home games.

Customers that require accessible seating may submit a request for these seats on their ticket application. Please specify accessible or wheelchair so the ticket office may better serve you. Due to a limited number of handicap-accessible seats, we allow a maximum of four tickets to be purchased in those specific areas based on availability. Any additional seats will be best-available based on IPTAY priority.

## **AWAY-GAME TICKET INFORMATION**

Away-game tickets are allocated based on IPTAY Priority Points. For some away games, a Priority Point cutoff as well as ticket limits may be put in place to give as many IPTAY donors as possible the opportunity to purchase tickets. In the event that the number of orders received for an away game exceeds the available allotment, a Priority Point cutoff will be established, and those who do not meet the point requirement will be notified and refunded the purchase price.




#### North and South Stand Suites:









## **FOOTBALL PARKING**

To join at a level higher than the Tiger level, you will receive the credit that a Tiger level donor receives based on your graduation date. For example, if a May 2015 graduate wants to join at the Jervey level which is \$4,600, they would receive a credit of \$1,440 off the \$4,600 donation. So they would be able to join at the Jervey level for \$3,160.

## THE TEAM BEHIND THE SUCCESS: IPTAY REPRESENTATIVES

IPTAY is the great success it is today because of a dedicated network of volunteers who serve Clemson Athletics across the country as the IPTAY Representative Program (REP). This group of nearly 700 men and women work within the regions where they live to encourage Clemson alumni and friends to join IPTAY and support the student-athletes who rely on this support. They actively recruit new leadership gifts and create a link between Clemson and it constituents.

#### IPTAY REPs are vital, always willing to:

- Contact prospective donors
- Contact previous donors who have not renewed
- Contact current donors about increasing their level of giving
- Contact recent graduates about their IPTAY involvement
- Assist staff in maintaining accurate records
- Provide donor news to the IPTAY office
- Refer prospective major gift donor names
- Abide by all Clemson, ACC and NCAA guidelines, rules and regulations

#### In return for their vital role in IPTAY success, REPs receive:

- Invitations to REP-only events
- Rewards for helping meet IPTAY annual goals
- REP Incentive Points based on the contributions of the donors assigned to them that can be used to purchase exclusive Clemson items as a reward for their loyalty.
  - Each renewal dollar = 1 point
  - Each upgrade dollar = 2 points
  - Each new dollar donated = 3 points
- REPs who signup multiple new donors are eligible for rewards such as on-field recognition and meetings with coaches and players







## THE GOVERNANCE OF IPTAY

The business and affairs of IPTAY are managed by the voting members of the Board of Directors, consisting of the following: At-large directors:

- 10 District Directors elected from 10 geographic districts (7 are from S.C.)
- Serve up to three two-year terms
- May "rotate" off the board after their terms have expired and be renominated after being off the board for a minimum of one year
  - Five immediate past-presidents make up the Nominating Committee
  - Replacement Director The president of IPTAY may elect to resign his/her position as a District Director and be replaced.

#### Clemson Directors (non-voting members):

- President of Clemson University (Ex-Officio)
- Two members of the Clemson Board of Trustees (appointed by the Board Chair)
- President of the Clemson Alumni Association (Ex-Officio)
- NCAA Faculty Representative (Ex-Officio)

#### Life Directors (non-voting members):

Past presidents not serving on the Nominating Committee.

#### IPTAY Officers (one-year term with possible second consecutive term):

- President
- President-Elect
- Secretary
- Treasurer

#### The Chief Executive Officer of IPTAY

The chief executive officer of IPTAY is a Clemson employee, responsible for the general management and fundraising programs as well as the implementation of board-enacted policies, and reports to the IPTAY Board of Directors and to the president of the University.

#### **CEO of IPTAY and Athletic Director**

In order to conduct fundraising activities, the CEO of IPTAY and Athletic Director (AD) work closely together, with the AD communicating with the IPTAY board and CEO concerning long- and short-term plans for the Athletic Department in order that those plans may be successfully completed.

#### IPTAY and the Athletic Ticket Office

IPTAY is responsible for the Seat Equity Plan (per-seat donation) as well as the Priority Points system. The director of ticket operations and staff report to the Athletics Department, are housed in the IPTAY Center and work closely with IPTAY in administering both programs. FAQs

#### Is my gift tax deductible?

IPTAY donations are generally 80 percent tax deductible if a donor purchases season tickets and 100 percent deductible without season tickets. Please consult with your tax adviser for more information.

#### Can I transfer my membership?

IPTAY memberships cannot be transferred to another person. IPTAY memberships can only be passed to a spouse.

\*Lifetime Memberships are no longer available.

#### How can I start a company membership?

All new company memberships are required to be donors at the McFadden level (\$6,000) or above. Annually, each company membership will be required to submit to the IPTAY office a certificate of good standing and a tax identification number or similar proof of company status.

#### How many IPTAY members are there?

As of July, 1, 2014, There are 14,906 IPTAY donors. The Collegiate Club has more than 6,000 members and the Tiger Cub Club and IPTAY CATS have more than 2,300 members.

## *What is the relationship between Clemson Athletics and IPTAY?*

IPTAY is a non-profit entity with a volunteer Board of Directors that works with the Clemson University Department of Athletics to serve its mission by raising private funds and providing necessary resources to achieve success.




#### How long has IPTAY been around?

IPTAY is widely regarded as the father of athletic fundraising. The IPTAY Scholarship Fund traces its roots to the 1930s. Dr. Rupert Fike is credited with being the originator of IPTAY, but the seed that Dr. Fike needed for his now much-envied group was planted there by then-Head Football Coach Jess Neely.

This means that Clemson University is responsible for your actions.Violations of NCAA rules, regardless of your intentions, can jeopardize a student-athlete's opportunity to attend and compete for Clemson University. Violations also result in severe penalties for the University and the individual booster involved.
