Almost all of us carry in our recent Clemson memories an image of President Emeritus James Barker — shaking thousands of hands at graduation, jogging across campus, doing pushups at home football games, addressing a large crowd or a small classroom. For 14 years, James F. Barker '70 served as Clemson University's 14th president and an ardent cheerleader for the University. During that period, the University

- added more than 57,000 alumni, or 43 percent of our total living alumni;
- set records for student SAT scores, retention and graduation rates;
- raised more than \$863 million in private funding;
- surpassed the \$100-million-a-year mark in research expenditures;
- completed, constructed or designed almost 3 million square feet of space; and
- launched several major economic development initiatives including the Clemson University International Center for Automotive Research in Greenville, the Clemson University Restoration Institute in North Charleston and the Advanced Materials Center in Anderson County.

Clearly, these have been some great years for Clemson.

Administrators and faculty, realizing Barker's potential and his dilemma, awarded him the Langdon Cheves Scholarship. "The scholarship money was not a huge amount, but it was exactly what I needed to pay for my senior year," said Barker. "And that scholarship made all the difference to me at that moment in time, as well as in the course my life took from that point forward."
