Primary Roles/Expectations

- Provide in-class facilitation for CU 1010, educating students on academic strategies, campus resources, and self-management tools.
- Facilitate discussion with students about academic and self-management difficulties, providing skills and strategies for improvement in a one-on-one and group setting.
- Collaborate with other Peer Success Leaders and ASC staff to present workshops and other educational programming to students and campus-constituents.
- Assist the ASC with any on-campus events, promoting the mission and vision of the Academic Success Center and Clemson University.
- Observe ASC staff in classrooms and interactions with students to learn the practice of presenting and coaching.
- Attend all training sessions throughout the fall and spring semester.

Requirements

- Maintain a cumulative GPA of 2.75 and show consistent academic performance.
- Possess a willingness to learn and desire to grow professionally.
- Must enroll in CU 1110 (1-hour for credit class) in the fall 2016 semester. The course meets on Wednesdays from 3:30 p.m. to 4:20 p.m.

About the Peer Success Leader Program

As a Peer Success Leader, you will be a connection for students struggling academically. By providing academic and self-management strategies in a variety of environments, you will serve as a meaningful resource and positive representation of the Academic Success Center.

This is a new position. Skills training and the CU 1110 course will focus on skill development, theories of student development, and opportunities to observe ASC presentations.

Students selected as Peer Success Leaders will be employed by the ASC and will earn \$9.00/hour upon completion of critical training components.
