³ Elective hours may be used for courses not required by General Education or your major curriculum and may be taken in any combination or at any time during your college career.

⁴ See General Education Requirements list in the catalog. Global Challenges credit hours must be selected from two different fields unless identified as interdisciplinary. At least three credit hours must be selected from a course(s) at the 3000-level or higher. A transfer course may not be used to satisfy the 3xxx or 4xxx level General Education Global Challenges Requirement. Approved 1xxx-2xxx level courses may be transferred for the "any level" equivalent.
