Notes:

- A. To comply with the South Carolina REACH ACT, all undergraduate students who enter the university during summer 2021 or after **must pass one of the following courses – HIST 1010, POSC 1010, or POSC 1030**. This course may count as a requirement in any part of the program of study including the major, minor, general education, or as a free elective. This requirement may be completed with corresponding AP, IB, or dual enrollment credit for these courses. Additional courses may be approved which can satisfy this requirement. Successful completion of coursework in compliance with the REACH ACT is required for graduation.
- B. At least 50 percent of the total credits taken in ACCT, ECON, FIN, LAW, MGT, and MKT must be taken at Clemson University.

¹ Placement into the appropriate math class is based on the student's score from the Clemson Math Placement Test or the math portion of their SAT or ACT test. The following math sequences are acceptable: MATH 1020/2070, MATH 1060/1080 or MATH 1060/2070. If a student elects to take MATH 1060 or 1080, one credit-hour will be applied toward the elective hour requirement. Students considering a graduate degree in ECON should begin with MATH 1060. **See advisor for approval of course selection.**

² Students considering a graduate degree in ECON or related fields should take MATH 3020. The math sequence becomes MATH 1060, 1080, 2060, and 3020. MATH 2060 will count as an elective.

³ Elective hours may be used for courses not required by General Education or your major curriculum and may be taken in any combination or at any time during your college career.

⁴ See General Education requirements list in the catalog. If this requirement is met through the completion of another General Education requirement, students will have three additional elective hours. Students must complete 120 total hours.

⁵ FIN 3110 is recommended for students minoring in Financial Management.

⁶ Three credit hours must be selected from ECON 3440, 3500, 3600, 4020, 4040, 4100, 4240, 4260, 4350, 4550. Note: Only ECON courses numbered 3160 and above may be used to satisfy the major requirement.
