NOTE: Curriculum worksheets are supplemental planning aids. Every effort is made to ensure accuracy; however, it is the student's responsibility to understand and meet degree requirements as stated in the applicable Undergraduate Catalog. Pre-Business is not a degree-granting program. All Pre-Business students must complete the Pre-Business <u>freshman core</u> and have a cumulative grade-point average of *2.0 or better before* being admitted into the Financial Management major. Registration for 3000-and 4000-level business courses may be restricted to students in their degree major, so students should endeavor to complete the core requirements and declare Financial Management as a major as soon as possible.
