 - Commercial Banking and Investments Emphasis Area: FIN 4110; and three courses selected from FIN 4050, FIN 4060, FIN 4070, and FIN 4080;
 and one course selected from FIN 3040, FIN 3990, or any 4000-level FIN course, or any 3000- or 4000-level ACCT course.
 - Corporate Finance Emphasis Area: FIN 4110; and one course selected from FIN 4010 or FIN 4020; one course selected from FIN 4030 or FIN 4040; and two courses selected from FIN 3040, FIN 3990, or any 4000-level FIN course, or any 3000- or 4000-level ACCT course. Only one 3000- or 4000-level ACCT course may count toward the emphasis area.
 - Financial Planning Emphasis Area: ACCT 4040 (should be taken spring of Junior year), ACCT 4080, FIN 3040, FIN 4050 and FIN 4090. Due to CFP Board requirements, no substitutions are allowed.
 - Real Estate Emphasis Area: FIN 4150, FIN 4160, FIN 4170, LAW 3330; and one course selected from CRP 4010, ECON 3060, ECON 3400, or FIN 3990, or any 4000-level FIN course, or any 3000- or 4000-level ACCT course.
