## **Finding Housing:**

Securing housing will need to be a priority for you as you prepare for your upcoming move to Clemson. Finding housing while outside the U.S. is a challenge. Here is some information to help with the challenge:

- <u>Undergraduate Student Housing:</u> All unmarried, first-year students who are under the age of 21 at the time of enrollment are required to live in university-owned housing for the fall and spring semesters. For information on on-campus housing, visit the <u>Clemson Home webpage</u>.
- <u>Graduate Students:</u> On-campus housing is not available for master's or Ph.D. students. International Student Organizations are a good source of information on where most international students live in the area. For guidance on off-campus housing, please refer to the helpful information below:

  - o Students attending classes in Greenville, Charleston, and/or other locations should contact their program coordinators for information on housing options in these specific areas.

### Travel to the U.S.:

As a reminder, international students are allowed to arrive in the U.S. no earlier than 30 days prior to





the start of classes. Clemson University will begin classes on **May 13, 2025**, so new students can enter the U.S. on or after **April 13, 2025**. If you are an international student transferring your active SEVIS record to Clemson University from another U.S. school, you can remain in the U.S. this summer or return to the U.S. with a Clemson I-20 prior to **April 13, 2025**.

- Prior to traveling to the U.S., you must review your I-20/DS-2019 for accuracy and **print and sign** the bottom of page 1 by hand.
- Make sure to have easy access to your passport and I-20/DS-2019 while traveling. You will need to show these items to officials so having them safely in your carry-on bag is preferred. Clemson also recommends having documents proving funding on you as well when you arrive.
- Remember to carry physical documents with you. Do not present digital copies of your documents through an electronic device to the Customs and Border Protection (CBP) officer.
- Please be mindful of increased scrutiny by CBP officers when requesting entry into the U.S. They
  may ask to see your phone, review social media, etc., and ask you additional questions about your
  reasons for traveling to the U.S.

New International Student Orientation for both Summer and Fall admission is scheduled to take place in August. The exact time and location will be determined shortly. Further information regarding this will be sent in our next email series.

## **Airport Shuttles:**

Clemson University offers airport shuttles from Greenville-Spartanburg Airport and the Charlotte Douglas International Airport. You can find information on the shuttle service <a href="here">here</a>. If the Clemson shuttle is not convenient for your arrival time or location, you can use commercial shuttles/taxis to bring you to Clemson. Commercial shuttles/taxis can be expensive, especially if you arrive in Charlotte or Atlanta. Please email or call shuttle or taxi companies in advance for cost and availability of transportation if you wish to use their services.

- The distance from Greenville-Spartanburg Airport to Clemson is 45 miles (72.4km) [55-minute drive]. Information on shuttles and taxis can be found <a href="https://example.com/here">here</a>.
- The distance from the Charlotte Douglas International Airport and Clemson is 130 miles (209km) [2-hour drive]. Information on shuttles and taxis can be found <a href="here">here</a>.
- The distance from Hartsfield-Jackson Atlanta International Airport and Clemson is 130 miles (209km)
   [2-hour drive]. Information on shuttles and taxis can be found <a href="here">here</a>.
