




Wooten & Brock Repeat Winners at 30th annual Club Championship

August Status

After a very dry July, August turned wet. The course really greened back up, but all the rain had a major impact on our maintenance activities. Because it rained on two consecutive Mondays, the verticutting of the fairways was cancelled, as were two scheduled topdressing of greens and lower 9 fairway. It was also necessary to postpone our course wide fall fertilization from August 11 to September 3. The rain made it difficult to keep up our regular mowing schedule. Fortunately, we were up to date on our growth regulator applications, and nothing got away from us.

Even with the rain, play has not slowed down. The course shows some wear and tear, especially some of the par 3 tees. The natural areas on the course have been moved as scheduled. The "turnip patches" have been moved as well, and we will be reseeding them in September.

September Goals

Last year we did a micro tine aerification of the greens on Tuesday and Wednesday after the Clemson Women's Golf Team event. Due to hosting the Tiger Golf Gathering on the Thursday after the Women's event, we pushed this work to Monday September 1. This work is not disruptive to ball roll and should only remain visible for 7-10 days. In addition, we will be focusing on the following:

- Continue to verticut and lightly topdress greens as long as the temperature stays warm.
- Spread our fall feed fertilizer application on Wednesday the 3rd
- Treat the course for fire ants which will be emerging with the cooler temperatures
- Begin Spring Dead Spot control applications to greens, tees and fairways, once the soil temperatures reach 72 degrees. This is the temperature at which the pathogen becomes active and when fungicides are most effective.
- Apply a Potassium based fertilizer to the greens to assist hardening off.
- Apply growth regulator to greens to control seed heads that occur around the third week of the month.
- Prep and re-seed natural areas on 2,6 and 5.

Raise the height of cut slightly on tees and fairways around mid-month to allow some additional growth prior to the onset of dormancy. This assists the bermudagrass in surviving the cold months of the year while it is not actively growing and gives us more of a base to withstand traffic during the months when it is not growing.

New "Employee"

We have a new "employee" on staff. On July 23rd, we took delivery of a Husqvarna 580L EPOS automower. "Otto", as we have named him, was purchased to mow the area between and around the pond, 18th green, Sole' patio and the Neiri Alumni Center. As it became apparent to us that this was going to be a difficult area to mow due to noise, dust and clipping cleanup issues, we knew we needed an alternative. Having seen other clubs utilize this technology and recalling the demo we had last year; we had another demo to make sure the mower could handle the steep slope and tight terrain.

The mower is entirely autonomous. It's nearly set it and forget it. It mows nearly constantly and docks and charges itself as needed when its battery runs low. Because it is constantly mowing, it never produces many clippings, thus minimizing any cleanup, and is very quiet. The mower is controlled by satellite through an app on our phones. Maintenance is minimal. The only requirements are to clean it occasionally and change the blades every couple of weeks.

We are looking to employ this technology on the driving range once it re-opens.

Driving Range Update

Work continues on the driving range and parking lot project. We were hampered in August by all the rain but were able to lay 25 truckloads of sod the last two weeks of the month. The tee is coming in nicely. The green is growing in slower than I would like. Currently there is not a set day or timeline to say when the range will open.

The parking lot should be complete this month, and we will be switching over to a new entrance to the golf course as well as beginning to use the permanent new cart path to get to hole 1.

Home Lawn Tip

For those of you with warm season lawns who want to try to keep them weed free this winter, now is the time to apply a pre-emergent herbicide for winter annuals and poa annua (annual bluegrass). Most Home and Garden centers have a material in granular form that you can apply. Often times you can find it impregnated on a Potassium fertilizer carrier such as a 0-0-7 or an 0-0-15. Potassium is important for warm season lawns in the fall as it helps the turf to better handle the stress of dormancy. A follow-up application of herbicide in December or January will likely be necessary to achieve season long control and keep your lawn weed free until spring.

Question of The Month

Question: Why is there never a purple flag on the 4th and 9th greens?

Answer: The purple flag indicates a pin placement in the middle third of the green. Because these two greens are very shallow, it's difficult to divide them into front, middle and back like the other greens. Therefore, they are divided into front and back only, and left, middle and right from side to side to give us 6 sections like the other greens.
