
# **During Recording**

## For Video and Audio/Podcast Content

☐ [Advanced] Ensure appropriate audio contrast (https://bit.ly/2Q5BNMg).

## For Video Content

- Use sufficient <u>color contrast</u> (https://bit.ly/3utqIDP) and avoid <u>flashing</u> (https://bit.ly/3sWCGpf).
- ☐ Use more than color to convey importance or meaning within visuals.
- Avoid providing directions that require the ability to see color, location, shape, and/or size and avoid "this" and "here" descriptions such as "I'll take this and move it here") t.
- ☐ Provide audible descriptions of important visuals...








# **After Recording**

# For Video Content

- ☐ Add captions. Captions should:
  - Be accurate translations of speech.
  - Use correct grammar.
  - o Identify speakers (when more than one).
  - Indicate important sound effects with brackets (example: [applause])





# For Audio-only Content (i.e. Podcasts)

Provide a transcript that meets all but the last bullet in the "Add captions[...]" list above.
