## IMPORTANT DATES AND DEADLINES FOR TRANSFER STUDENTS

Transfer admissions is becoming increasingly competitive, and applications are reviewed on a rolling basis as they become complete. Admission is closed when all classroom space has been committed.

We will notify you by email when we receive your application and keep you updated on the status of your application while it's under consideration.

August 1	Application opens for Spring admission.
December 1	Deadline to apply for Spring admission (January enrollment). Application opens for Fall and Summer admission.
December 15	Deadline for official transcripts. All transcripts (except those for your current term) must be postmarked by this date.
July 1	Final deadline to apply for Fall admission.

# APPLYING TO TRANSFER TO CLEMSON

1. Review important dates and deadlines.
2. Complete the application through the Clemson Application.
3. Request final official transcripts from the registrar at each college previously attended. If you took college-level courses (dual enrollment) while in high school, be sure to send official transcripts from the institution where credit was earned.

## TO IMPROVE YOUR CHANCE FOR ADMISSION, YOU SHOULD:

1. Complete a year of college study — after high school graduation — earning 30 semester hours or 45 quarter hours of transferable credit. Advanced Placement, International Baccalaureate and dual-enrollment credit may not be used to count toward the 30 semester hours (45 quarter hours) requirement.
2. Earn a cumulative grade-point average of 2.5 or higher on a 4.0 scale — 3.0 preferred.
3. Complete first-year-level courses in English, science and mathematics for your intended major at Clemson University.
4. Be in good standing and eligible to return to the institution last attended.

### TRANSFERRING CREDITS FROM ANOTHER INSTITUTION

The Transfer Course Equivalency List (TCEL) is a database containing the Clemson University course equivalencies for approximately 1,200 accredited colleges and universities nationwide. Course equivalencies are evaluated through the Office of Admissions.

The TCEL represents courses that have transferred credit to Clemson before. The TCEL is not comprehensive. Please be advised that the TCEL is only a history of how courses have transferred to Clemson, and it does not represent a complete list of transferable coursework for any school.

### MAJOR-SPECIFIC REQUIREMENTS

There are specific majors at Clemson that, due to grade-point average requirements and/or enrollment limitations, are more competitive. Students interested in one of these majors will need to select a second choice of major when applying to allow more flexibility in the review process.

## TRANSFER COUNCIL AND UNDERGRADUATE STUDENT GOVERNMENT

Transfer Council is a crucial part of Clemson's Undergraduate Student Government. All members of Transfer Council transferred into Clemson, and they have a unique perspective on what new transfer students face. Transfer Council works to support programs for transfer students and provides a representative voice for the transfer student population on campus. Being a part of this group means the opportunity to make a difference in the lives of others sharing the transfer experience with you.

## TRANSFER 2 TIGER MENTOR PROGRAM (T2T)

The Transfer 2 Tiger Mentor Program (T2T) is a peer-to-peer mentoring opportunity for new transfer students to connect with upperclassmen transfer students. The purpose of a transfer-specific mentor program is to help cultivate a support system within the transfer community at Clemson. In order to apply as a T2T mentor, current transfer students are required to have at least one semester completed at Clemson. All incoming transfer students will have the opportunity to sign up as a T2T mentee at the beginning of their first semester.

Located in the heart of Clemson's campus near Cooper Library and the Watt Family Innovation Center, the Academic Success Center (ASC) offers a variety of free services for all undergraduate students. ## FINANCIAL AID

Financial aid is usually awarded based on need in order to supplement the amount you and your parents can contribute to your college expenses. The University also awards some scholarships based entirely on academic merit.

Clemson offers financial aid in the following forms:

- Grants.
- Scholarships.
- Loans.
- Part-time employment.

## LEGISLATIVE INCENTIVES FOR FUTURE EXCELLENCE (LIFE) SCHOLARSHIPS

The LIFE Scholarship is valued at \$5,000 per year. This is a renewable scholarship for residents of South Carolina who are enrolled full time. Awards are made automatically; no scholarship application is required.

## LIFE ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS FOR TRANSFER STUDENTS

To receive the LIFE Scholarship, you must meet all general eligibility requirements. Eligibility for the first year at Clemson is based on your initial college enrollment and the cumulative GPA and hours earned (nonremedial) at your previous institution(s). This will include both in-state and out-of-state institutions. After your first year at Clemson, all the requirements for continuing students will apply.
