LETTER TO HILL 11-22-57

NOTES ON CLEMSON CEMETERY

1. We recommend that all existing unassigned lots, where practicable, be re-surveyed and reduced to a standard size conforming to cemetery lots of today. ✓
"The average size of a modern four-grave plot is 8' x 20', the eight foot dimension being North and South and the twenty foot dimension, East and West."

2. We recommend that special funds be provided to the Grounds Department for ~~maintenance~~ *maintenance* of the Clemson Cemetery as follows:

- To accomplish the following*
- a. Removal of dead or dangerous trees.
 - b. Roads and walks within the cemetery proper. That the roads and walks be surface treated with gravel.
 - c. That the existing water line be extended and a frostproof faucet to be within one hundred feet of all graves and that a master cut-off valve for the entire line be provided to prevent use of unauthorized users. In no instance would the College be supposed to furnish garden hose to water individual plots.
 - d. All plot owners are to maintain their own plots.
 - e. In time, all existing trees in the Woodland Cemetery will be extinct. The future landscaping plans should include such appropriate trees indigenous to this cemetery and this locale as pine, white oak, sourwood, gum and maple.
 - f. Provide permanent markers of concrete with a brass or copper plate at each lot for identifying purposes.
 - g. Enclose area of colored graveyard within a securely constructed wire fence. There is a space approximately 100' x 125' about 400 feet west of Calhoun plot enclosure.
