
# **Viewing Organization Details**

- Calendar view




#### **To View Location Details**

These headings may include:


- General

# Viewing the Organization List view


The List view shows you a list of events associated with this organization within a table.

Navigate to the bottom of the list view to navigate next to last or by using the dropdown arrows.

#### To Sort Items in List View

The column that is sortable is the Event column. If you click the down arrow, the data sorts in ascending order. Click again to sort in descending order.




# To Choose Which Columns Display in List View

Use the **Choose Columns** button to reveal of a list of available table column. Check the boxes next to any you wish to display.




#### To View Additional Details of Items in List View

Click on the information in blue, typically the event name to view event details



### Viewing the Organization Details in Calendar View

The Calendar view shows you an easy to read grid of days on which events take place associated with the organization.



# **To Change the Start Date of the Calendar View of Search Results**

Image: Use the date picker to choose which dates to display in the Calendar view.



Click on the date to reveal a date picker, then choose the start date using the calendar icon.

You can also use the arrow buttons at the bottom of the calendar grid to shift the dated display backward or forward in time.
