Hazardous Materials Spills

Clemson University Fire Department is the Hazardous Materials Incident Response **Team for Clemson University**

If you have a hazardous material spill (i.e. chemical, biological, or radioactive) you should vacate the lab/area, close

Immediately call 911 or 656-2222 and report the incident giving your name and location. You will need to stay in the area to give information to the emergency responders.

Small Spills

If you have a "small" spill, and the following is in place:

- You have been trained to clean up spills.
- You are comfortable doing so; Clemson does not require anyone to clean up a spill.
- Your department/department head/Principal

define what is considered a small spill, but this will greatly depend on the hazardous material that is spilled.

If you are not trained or any of the above are not in place, reach out to the OES small spill cleanup team for assistance with cleanup.

Important Note

All wastes generated from a spill will be considered chemical, biological, and radioactive waste, and should be labeled as such, and the fill out the OES waste pickup request form:

Spill Kits

Spill kits are required for all areas that work with Hazardous Materials.

required as long as supplies are made available.

Spill kits may be placed in an area on each floor of your building as long as all faculty, staff, and students are aware of the location and has access to them.

Spill kits should contain at a minimum:

- Absorbent pads & socks for acids/bases (aggressives)
- Goggles/Safety glasses
- Nitrile gloves
- Hazardous Waste Labels
