About Sharps

Sharps include needles, syringes, razor blades, scalpels and other sharp objects that could cause an injury by puncturing or penetrating the skin.

Safety Guidelines for working with Sharps

- 1. Employees and students need to receive proper instruction from their supervisor on the safe handling of sharps.
- 2. DO NOT uncap sharp objects until it is time to use them for the procedure.
- 3. DO NOT re-cap any needles/razors.
- 4. Keep the object always pointed away from yourself and other people.
- 5. Never bend a sharp object before disposal
- 6. Carefully dispose of used sharps immediately after use in designated sharps container
- 7. Never remove needle from syringe prior to disposal.
- 8. Sharps containers should be placed within arm's reach and as close to the procedure as possible.
- 9. Seal the container when it reaches fill line, or it is three-quarters full using the closure mechanism and request waste pickup online.

What to do after a sharps' injury?

- Wash affected area with soap and water for 15 minutes.
- Report incident to your supervisor as soon as possible.
- Go to Redfern Center for evaluation and treatment.
- In case of an emergency dial 911.

All sharps waste needs to be collected even uncontaminated sharps at Clemson University. The sharps container should be puncture resistant and with a tightfitting lid. The Office of OES provides sharps containers for free upon request.
