Policy Title: Biological Sample Collection

Section 1: Purpose

The purpose of this policy is to provide guidance on collecting biological samples for use in research, testing, teaching, or demonstration.

Section 2: Scope

This policy applies to all biological samples collected from University owned or leased vertebrate animals. This policy does not apply to samples collected for diagnostic purposes.

Section 3: Policy

Biological Samples

For the purposes of this policy, biological samples are any of the substances listed below collected directly from live vertebrate animals:

- Blood
- Urine
- Feces
- Ruminal contents
- Semen
- Vaginal secretions
- Milk
- Saliva
- Hair
- Ear notches
- Biopsies

Sample Collection

Biological samples can be collected for use in research, teaching, testing, or demonstration under either of the following circumstances:

- 1. The sample collection is completed as a part of an approved Animal Use Protocol by the personnel listed on the protocol. The sample collection must be described in the protocol and approved by the IACUC.
- 2. The sample collection is completed by the Office of Animal Resources veterinary care staff.
 - a. The Office of Animal Resources will maintain an approved Animal Use Protocol for biological sample collection.
 - b. Animal Resources will follow approved SOPs for all procedures.

- c. A log of all biological sample collections will be maintained by the Office of Animal Resources.
- d. Samples collected must be from random animals of the species requested. If serial collections on the same animal or collections from a specific individual animal are required, a separate protocol must be submitted and approved by the IACUC prior to collection of the samples.
