Internship Program Admissions

Several sources of information are used to assess candidates for internship, including the written application, letters of recommendation, and a statement of professional goals. Previous training experiences in college/university counseling centers are preferred, but other comparable experiences with emerging adult clients will be considered if the applicant is able to evidence a strong desire to work in a university counseling center setting. Zoom interviews are also a part of the application process and are scheduled by invitation. We invite approximately 30 applicants to interview with us each year. Selections are made without discrimination based on race, ethnicity, national origin, religion, gender, gender identity, age, ability, sexual/affective orientation, or veteran status. Interns who match with Clemson University CAPS Psychology Internship program must successfully complete a criminal background check in accordance with university policy.

Applicants for the internship should be doctoral candidates from APA-Accredited Counseling or Clinical Psychology graduate programs. Each applicant should have completed all pre-internship requirements for their university prior to the start date of internship. Generally, it is expected that an intern will have completed all required courses (at least three years of graduate study), will have passed their doctoral candidacy-qualifying exam (comprehensive exams), have successfully proposed their dissertation or research project prior to the start of internship, and completed at least 450 clinical intervention hours.
