Nieri took his Clemson degree out into that field, founding Great Southern Homes in 2004 and leading the company to become one of the top 50 residential construction businesses in the nation. In 2023, he took the company public to become United Homes Group.

The Nieri Family Department of Construction and Real Estate Development has risen to its own national prominence. This year, a team of Clemson students won first place at the prestigious Associated Builders and Contractors 2024 Construction Management Competition. Clemson's team posted the highest cumulative points in the competition's five categories and placed in the top three in four categories. Clemson's students topped teams from 25 colleges and universities across the country.

The Bachelor of Science in construction science and management curriculum is the basis for a career in construction or as a developer or building management specialist. As the largest single industry in the United States, construction offers unlimited opportunities to highly motivated and trained professionals. Future professionals must be skilled in managing people, equipment and capital, as well as have a thorough knowledge of construction materials and methods and the complex technologies of modern construction.

The Master of Real Estate Development (MRED) program creates future development entrepreneurs who will produce innovative quality communities through sustainable design and creative financing methods. The MRED degree is jointly offered through a partnership with the Wilbur O. and Ann Powers College of Business. The program's degree combines six disciplines that balance theoretical applications with realworld experience. The program offers MBA specializations with a more focused approach to the real estate industry. This interdisciplinary approach prepares Clemson MRED graduates to become visionaries who guide the multiple perspectives that converge during the development and building process.

For the past 10 years and counting, the Nieri Department of Construction and Real Estate Development has enjoyed a 100 percent job placement rate for its undergraduate construction science and management majors. The Nieris believe that Clemson can play a leading role in assuring the future of the industry will be equipped with well-trained and educated leadership.

The sky-high demand for graduates is a dream for students like Gracie Crosby. The Charleston senior has already secured a job after graduation with Trident Construction as a project engineer. She met her future employer at a department-sponsored career fair when she was just a sophomore, which led to two internships with Trident.
